- **History Trek** 400 Years of History in an Hour: Join Clinton County Historical Association and City Historian John Krueger for an historic stroll on the Terry Gordon Bike Path. Saturday, June 6, 2015.
- **Waste Water Treatment Plant Trek** Solve the mystery of how what goes down your drain gets cleaned, reclaimed, and made environmentally friendly. Come to the wastewater treatment plant and see how we help keep the lake clean! Park cars and bikes behind the Amtrak Train Station -- the Waste Water Treatment Plant is at the far side of the parking lot. Trek starts at 10 AM Saturday, June 20, 2015.
- **Kids Trek** Kids become little explorers when they join Kids' Station in discovering local plants and wildlife along the Saranac River Trail. Saturday, July 11, 2015.
- **Bioblitz Trek** Bring your smartphone, become citizen scientists, and learn how to identify species along the Saranac River Trail and understand the ecological importance of the Trail. Saturday, July 18, 2015, 10 AM.
- **Nature Trek** Learn about the ecological threats posed by invasive species as well as how to identify some of the pests currently affecting the Adirondack Park. This trek will be led by the Adirondack Park Invasive Plant Program. Saturday, August 15, 2015
- **Photo Trek** Your camera is a "seeing-eye" tool - bring your smartphone or other camera on the Photo Trek and use it with new awareness of your surroundings with Trek leaders Penelope Clute and Ron Nolland. 10 AM Saturday, August 29, 2015.
